II.a. That each rabbit in the shipment has been identified with an ISO standard microchip, the anatomical location of which is noted above;

II.b. That the country or zone of origin has been officially free from Tularemia, myxomatosis and Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease for at least one year prior to export;

II.c. That the rabbits were born and bred or have been reared for at least 12 months in country of export;

II.d. That the rabbits were at least six weeks of age prior to export;

II.e. That the rabbits were kept, since their birth, in the establishment of origin that is operating under a documented biosecurity plan approved by and under the supervision of the veterinary authority;

II.f. That the establishment of origin has not diagnosed any cases of:

- i. Rabies
- ii. treponematosi
- iii. Sylvatic plague

- iv. European brown hare syndrome
- v. Encephalitozoon and

II.g. That all the animals intended to be ship were isolated for 30 days prior to export in a facility approved by the veterinary authority. *(During isolation no animal of a different health status, other than those who meet the sanitary requirements of the Turks and Caicos Islands, must be in contact with those in the consignment to be shipped by being kept apart at a minimum distance of separation of 50 m. The veterinary authority of the exporting country may implement any measure that achieves the same level of isolation).* The date the animals went into isolation is written below:

Notes

- a. Transportation of the animals must be in accordance with the International Air Transport Association (IATA) Live Animal Regulations, approved by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE);
- b. The containers used for shipment of the rabbits must be new /unused or disinfected with a disinfectant chemical having a broad spectrum;
- c. Only paper and paper based litter, treat wood shavings or sterilised peat bedding are acceptable for shipment;
- d. In the event that during the course of transporting the rabbits to the Turks and Caicos Islands, they were transshipped via another country and remained there for twenty-four (24) hours and over, a veterinary certificate from the Veterinary Authority or from the Quarantine Officer must be obtained stating that the said rabbits did not leave the quarantine area, noting the period of time in quarantine and the condition of the rabbits;
- e. All relevant documents (originals of import permit, veterinary health certificate, vaccination certificate, laboratory test results, etc.) must be submitted at the port of entry in order to facilitate biosecurity clearance;
- f. Animal Health Services must be given at least 24 hours' notice of the confirmed arrival date, time and vessel/aircraft number and the port of entry to avoid delays in the clearance of the rabbits;
- g. The rabbit (s) must be **found clinically healthy** on arrival at the port of entry; and
- h. The rabbits must be kept in the container in which they were shipped until granted entry into the territory. Failure to do so can result in entry being denied.
