PART II: Sanitary Requirements
<p>I, the undersigned OFFICIAL VETERINARIAN certifies that the animal (s) described in I.17 above meet (s) the following requirements:</p> <p>II.a. That the country, zone or compartment of origin has been free of these diseases for the past ten years or the animal (s) has/have been quarantined and tested to be free of these diseases before leaving the exportation facility:</p> <p>Fish</p> <p>Infectious Salmon Anaemia, Epizootic Ulcerative Syndrome, Epizootic Haematopoietic Necrosis, Infectious Haematopoietic Necrosis, Koi Herpes virus Disease, Red Sea Bream Iridoviral Disease, Spring Viraemia of Carp, Infection with Gyrodactylus and Viral Haemorrhagic Septicaemia,</p> <p>Crustaceans</p> <p>Crayfish plague (Aphanomyces astaci), Infectious hypodermal and haematopoietic necrosis, Infectious myonecrosis, Necrotising hepatopancreatitis, Taura syndrome, White spot disease, White tail disease, and Yellow head disease.</p>


- II.c. That the facility of origin is currently participating in an ongoing monitoring and surveillance programme recognized by the aquatic animal health authority of the exporting country for at least the past two years and has a biosecurity plan as defined in the OIE's Aquatic Animal Health Code, that prevents the direct and indirect exposure of aquatic animals to diseases of concern named above.
- II.d. That the brood stock populations or the population to be imported have not experienced any unexplained morbidity or mortality events within the previous three months prior to import.
- II.e. That the aquatic animal(s) and their broodstock is/are not under any restriction by the exporting country's aquatic animal health authority or slated for destruction or slaughter for disease control purposes.
- II.f. That if the animal(s) is/are wild caught, they must not be under any harvest or other restrictions by the responsible competent authority.
- II.g. That all tests required for the aquatic animal(s) to qualify for export to The Turks and Caicos Islands was/were performed by a laboratory approved by the exporting country's authority for aquatic animal health.
- II.h. The scientific names of all the aquatic animal(s) in the consignment
- II.i. That the consignment was inspected by a licensed veterinarian of the exporting country's aquatic animal health authority within 72 hours of shipment and found to be without clinical evidence of disease
- II.j. That the animal(s) was/were transported to the place of shipment in specially constructed containers, previously cleansed and disinfected (done to standards implemented by the aquatic animal health authority of the exporting country) without coming into contact with other susceptible aquatic animals. When the transport of the aquatic animal(s) is done by air, such measures must be in accordance with the International Air Transport Association (IATA) Live Animal Regulations, approved by the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE).
- II.k. That the influent and transport water as well as any other susceptible aquatic animals which come into contact with the animals to be imported before shipment, must be either free of the diseases of concern named above or treated in a manner, approved by the aquatic animal health authority, that will destroy these pathogens prior to contact with the aquatic animals.

Notes

- a. In the event that during the course of transporting the animal to the Turks and Caicos Islands, it was transshipped via another country and remained there for twenty-four (24) hours and over, a veterinary certificate from the Veterinary Authority or from the Quarantine Officer must be obtained stating that the said animal (s) did not leave the quarantine area, noting the period of time in quarantine and the condition of the animal.
- b. All relevant documents (copy of import permit, and **originals** of the Veterinary Health Certificate, Vaccination certificate, Laboratory Test results, etc.) must be submitted at the port of entry in order to facilitate Veterinary clearance.

II.b. Certificate Reference Number:

- c. Animal Health Services must be given at least 24 hours' notice of the confirmed arrival date, time and vessel/aircraft number and the port of entry to avoid delays in the clearance of the animal (s).
- d. The live aquatic animal (s) must be **found clinically healthy** on arrival at the port of entry.
- e. The aquatic animal(s) must be kept in the container in which they were shipped until granted entry into the territory. Failure to do so can result in entry being denied.

Explanations
